Thank you for playing the game "Who is it"

You certainly know this game consists of 24 characters in which you need to find the one chosen by your opponent's game by asking questions to which we must answer that yes or no. His objective is to find your character.

This is version Karotz! Here the characters are Karotz images from the site <a href="http://finecarrots.com/">http://finecarrots.com/</a>.

You will play against your adorable companion (who has the game in its head), so you will attempt to discover the Karotz he has selected but it will also try to find yours.

The game is played in three rounds.

When it's his turn to play, the player can ask a single question and the answer can only be "YES" or "NO".

If you think you have found an answer to your questions you will have to wait until your next turn to propose your solution.

To propose your solution, use the keyword "SUGGEST" and Karotz will ask for your response.

As you may know, your Karotz might have difficulty to understand what you are saying and you will be asked to repeat your response.

It may happen that Karotz will think you have already asked the same question, but you have not. This is rare, but possible. It will ask you to repeat the question to determine an answer. If you are on level 1, you will be asked to try again.

When your question does not create a large sentence, tell Karotz the keyword you'd like to check, "Boy," "Girl," "Hair," "Bald", "Mustache", "Beardless", "Glasses" "Hat," "Mouth," "Red Ears," "Reds," "White Ears," "White" and of course "Suggest" and the "Yes" "No" in response to Karotz's questions. And of course the name of the character you think you've have found.

The next page is the game board. It must be printed on a sheet of paper or on a card. Cut along the dotted line in order to meet all the characters in the beginning of the game and reduce your chance of repeating the same question.

The last page of cards to be cut (or not) and you draw one at random as Karotz will have to guess. The key elements of this character are noted below. This will avoid misinterpretation.
